WATER PROJECTS



Xevitz, Guatemala

A 10,000L water storage tank is needed to ensure all residents can have an adequate supply. The current demand on the system, by its 560 residents, is exceeding its existing system and leaving many without water on a daily basis. A system-wide water usage study will be conducted to determine the appropriate solution to their water supply problem. Water meters are proposed to promote conservative use.

Nahuaterique, Honduras

There are five villages surrounding the town of Nahuaterique in the department of La Paz, on the border with El Salvador in need of water and sanitation facilities. The majority of the villagers do not have access to latrines or bathrooms. A number of projects are proposed for the area including water storage tanks, water distribution lines, and basic sanitation facilities such as latrines and bathrooms.

Le Pista, Guatemala

The health clinic in the village of La Pista experiences a nearly constant water shortage. Several families in La Pista have constructed wells on their properties for water collection; we propose construction of a well at the health clinic to provide water to correct their current deficit. A pump will be installed to send water to the existing elevated storage tank and provide a chlorination system to treat the water.

UNF Ghana Project

The UNF Ghana Project began in the Fall of 2007 at the Timale Children's Home, a home for abandoned children in impoverished northern Ghana, Africa. UNF provides engineering expertise for many types of engineering projects to improve the facility. This year the water system will be improved.

La Pista, Guatemala

The project consist of installing a 45' deep well within the school in La Pista. It will be located on the school's property and a submersible water pump will be placed inside the well, to pump water to the school's existing water tank. A water treatment system will also be installed and solar power may be utilized.

Corail Lamothe, Haiti

The impoverished people of the community must walk daily up to six hours roundtrip to obtain clean water. The water comes from a contaminated spring which over 2000 Corail Lamothe community members must share with thousands of people from neighboring communities. The project will involve the training and installation of community-wide household slow sand filters as well as the construction of a new 25,000 gallon rain catchment cistern to store rain water for the dry season.
